Host 18<sup>th</sup> Annual Ted Walker Youth Day**

(TUCSON, AZ) Old Tucson Studios will host over 3,000 fourth, fifth and sixth graders from Tucson and Pima County school districts during the 18th annual Ted Walker Youth Day on Thursday, January 22, 2009. The children will receive free park admission and a free lunch donated by the Dan Felix Memorial Foundation and Pima County Parklands Foundation.

The event, which features Wild West entertainment and educational exhibits, is designed to provide a fun-filled day of activity to local area school children who might not otherwise have this opportunity.
